



Please note the beautiful graphics inserted in the LOG represent our traditional Chrismons hung on the tree each year on the first Sunday of Advent. Chrismons are ancient symbols for Christ's ministry: the dove descending down, Jerusalem cross, shepherd's crook, chalice, shell, star, heart, butterfly, angel, rose, and crown are examples of Chrismons we use to adorn our Chrismon tree in the sanctuary. As always, gift cards and statements about the agencies involved will be available. You will be able to share the feelings of helping others with your generosity. See you at the Faire. Merry Christmas!






Redwoods has been a longtime supporter of Canal Alliance and their vital work in the community. They recently sent the following notice about their mission and work.
