Come along and bring your friends. We will sing Christian and secular favorites: Rudolf, his red nose and all that...

One day as I was walking through downtown San Anselmo, I heard someone call my name. As I turned around I saw my friend who I had not seen in a long time. She had her two grandchildren with her. The two-year-old smiled at me and said with excitement, "I have eyes!"

Ever since that day, the phrase 'I have eyes' has stuck with me. I am reminded how God often uses the innocence and wonder of a child's vision to remind us that we, too, have eyes, eyes that are already gifted with seeing God's newness in a child's eyes, in the autumn leaves that lie scattered in our yards and along sidewalks, and in circumstances that challenge us to give up the old, familiar way of doing things.

Have you thought about what you would do if an earthquake or other disaster happened here in Marin?

"Get Ready Marin," a countywide disaster preparedness program, emphasizes the critical importance of the ability of Marin residents to survive in their homes for 72 hours following a disaster. This first line of defense, called "Shelter in Place," is expected to save more lives than any other personal preparedness effort.

"Get Ready" says that we must prepare mentally (know what to do) and prepare physically (assemble supplies). So how do we get started? We prepare by taking a class and by gathering up what we will need. You can find listings of class times and supplies at www.getreadylarkspur.org. Just click on "Take a class" or "Download materials."

But wait, how many times have you thought about attending a class and you just don't seem to get around to it? To make it easier for you, the Deacons are arranging for a class at the church, most likely right after Sunday worship, on a date to be decided. Counseling Corner

One of the topics I have written about in this column is dealing with stress during this time of year – a time that is fun and exciting and yet also can be anxiety-producing.

We can't avoid stress in our lives. It's an integral part of being human and we're designed to cope with it as part of everyday life – even at times when there is excessive stimulus, like the holidays. Without stress to challenge us and keep us active and alert, we would atrophy and never progress. Stress in itself is neither good nor bad, right or wrong.

Recently a colleague gave a group of us at Aldea a list entitled "Ways to Feel Better Right Now!" as ways of coping with stress. I think some of the ideas can help us get through some of the intensity of this time of year. They are small things, yet effective if used at the right time.

- Stop whatever you are doing, close your eyes, and take ten slow, deep breaths.
- Go to a quiet room and read a good book for a short time.
- Listen to your favorite music.
- Pray, meditate, or focus on your special relaxation word or phrase.
- Drink a nice, warm cup of chai tea.
- Listen to, watch, or read something funny.
- Go outside and take a walk.
- Run in place for five minutes.

- Call a friend and have a good conversation.
- Sing aloud.
- Take a warm bath.
- Tell yourself that things will calm down.

You probably have your own techniques for calming down when the holiday preparations and activities become too much. Let's share them with each other!

God bless everyone for a wonderful and fairly stress free holiday!
