On World Communion Sunday, October 1, members and friends of Redwoods Presbyterian Church will participate in one of four annual Special Offerings, the Peace and Global Witness Offering. The proceeds of the Offering go toward the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program and Global Mission and 25% is retained for Local Mission. The Mission Outreach Committee will meet in September to determine the local agency to benefit from our Offering. The theme of this year's Offering – "A Persistent Dream of Peace."

The following is a brief description of the Offering's history:

1980 - The 192nd General Assembly established the Peacemaking Offering to 'celebrate our common life in the global bonds of Christ's peace-giving body...to support initiatives on peacemaking and peace education throughout the church.

 $1988\mbox{ -}$ The Peacemaking Offering became one of the four Special Offerings of the church.

2014 - The 221st General Assembly approved the transition of the Peacemaking Offering to Peace and Global Witness. (source-pcusa.org)
